## REPORT ON WORKSHOP

The Institutional Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Sri V.S. Sivalingam Chettiar Government Degree College hosted an OBE workshop for faculty members on June 30, 2022, in the Digital Classroom. The principal of the college **Dr. SLB Sankar Sarma**, the chief guest of the workshop, also discusses its significance. According to IQAC coordinator **Dr. V. Raja**, who presided over the event, outcome-based education is all the rage in Indian higher education right now. In many colleges, it is currently being quickly adopted. OBE is viewed as a huge step forward in improving education standards in general and helping Indian graduates compete with graduates from other nations. Here are four things about outcome-based compensation you need to know.

**Dr. M. Ramakrishna Reddy**, Principal of NBKR Science and Arts College, Vidyanagar, served as the workshop's resource person during the first session. He discussed the importance of talking about academic quality work, OBE components, Program Educational Objectives (PEO), Program and Course Outcomes, Mapping of Mission, PEOs, PLOs, and CLOs, the process of OBE, Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) and Bloom's Taxonomy.

**Sri T. Rajesh**, Head of the Computer Science Department and Coordinator of the IQAC at NBKR Science and Arts College, Vidyanagar, served as the resource person for the second session. According to the speaker's explanation in his presentation, a constructive alignment is an approach to teaching that is outcome-based and in which the learning objectives that students are expected to meet are established before teaching even starts. To best achieve those objectives and determine the degree of success, teaching and testing strategies are then developed. It provides a framework for adjusting curriculum and assessment to address achieving those goals and standards. Constructive alignment is effective in designing teaching and assessment that help students learn, as opposed to keeping students in the dark about what is covered in their course of study or what they will be tested on. There were 22 academic staff members present. **Dr. J. Subrahmanyam**, a physics professor, thanked every one of the attendees for their active participation.

The workshop is being organized as a sign of commitment to implementing the programs between the two colleges, NBKR Science and Arts College and Sri V.S. Sivalingam Chettiar Government Degree College, as outlined in the Memorandum of Understanding.
