Dr. S.L.B. Sankara Sarma, the college's principal, welcomed the teachers and resource people, emphasising the need to focus all of our efforts on SSR preparation. He then declared the workshop open.

Dr. Ch. Rama Devi, the resource person, started the first session by explaining the guidelines of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council. The NAAC Accreditation Process and its advantages for higher education institutions have gotten a lot of press. To improve understanding of the IQAC process and procedures by reviewing the updated NAAC accreditation's qualitative and quantitative measures (Q₁M and Q_nM) and applying best practises to improve the quality of the institutions.

Dr. P. Sujana, Associate Professor of Chemistry, highlighted in the second session that the IIQA should not be submitted until the SSR has been finished. Year-by-year information must be provided. An attendance list, some photographs and videos, and an event report are required for all events. It's probable that a large number of activities will go uncounted. Profiles of students from the preceding five years will be compiled. A student satisfaction survey is launched as soon as SSR begins. During the assessment period, at least one administrative and one green audit must be completed.

The principal congratulated the IQAC coordinator for organising the one-day NAAC Awareness event in the third session. He also thanked the resource people for sharing their knowledge. The IQAC coordinator, Dr.V. Raja, proposed a vote of thanks and expressed gratitude to the resource persons, principal, vice-principal, sub-committees, and all the attendees for making the event a great success.
