**CONSUMER BENEFITS AND PRICE RELIEF**

-  Household essentials like soaps, toothpaste, and Indian breads now fall under the 5% or Nil GST slab, making daily living more affordable.
-  Life-saving drugs and medical equipment saw GST drop from 12% to 5% or Nil, improving access to healthcare.
-  Two-wheelers, small cars, TVs, ACs, and cement moved from 28% to 18%, offering significant savings to middle-class consumers.
